Course Content (Short Description)		The process of harmonization of private laws and private international laws is an effort of engaging the society in inter-cultural communication. In order to realize the value of this effort, this course aims to provide a framework for an advanced comprehension of European private law and private international law in comparative perspective. By focusing on the mechanics of European private law from a comparative view, the students will be urged to analyze the impacts of Community legislation on the national legal systems. The role of model laws and CISG in the reform process of national laws will also be assessed. The reform processes of Turkish law that has also been influenced by the unification process of private law in Europe will also be evaluated within this context.
